13th International Congress on Mathematical Education (ICME) Hamburg, Germany, July 24–31, 2016

Topic Study Group 24:

The history of the teaching and learning of mathematics

The aim of the TSG is to provide a forum for the discussion of findings and unsolved problems in the history of mathematics education as well as of issues in methodology of research in this field. During the last years research in the history of mathematics education has been actively developed – important books and articles, specialized conferences, specialized journals, and special issues of some major serials have been devoted to the relevant topics. Still, it is very clear that many themes are not explored sufficiently and sometimes almost nothing is known about some periods and regions. Additionally, the history of mathematics education is often explored from a local (or national) point of view only. Often connections with similar processes happening elsewhere need to be revealed and understood. This TSG is supposed to help researchers in identifying new topics and new techniques for studies and in establishing fruitful collaboration in their work.

How to Join the Group

The submission process is described on ICME's site (<http://www.icme13.org>)

It will be arranged via *Conftool*, which requires to open an account for the submission process (to do it go to LOGIN menu at <http://www.icme13.org> or directly to <https://www.conftool.pro/icme13/>).

An ICME-13 template is available at the website (http://icme13.org/proposals_and_paper_submission) and must be used (submitting paper in another format can cause serious delays or even exclusion from the review process).

Participants are welcome to submit now either

- a paper, 4 pages maximum or
- a poster, a 1 page description of the planned poster, not the poster itself.

Later, the authors of the papers selected for presentation within the regular sessions of the Topic Study Groups will be invited to extend their papers up to 8 pages.

Importantly, post-conference publications (by Springer) are also planned in the form of special volumes for each TSG.

Timeline and Deadlines

1st Sept. – 1st Oct. 2015	Submission of posters by those intending to apply for the solidarity fund
10th – 20th December 2015	Decisions on acceptance of papers or posters sent out
1st Oct. – 22nd Dec. 2015	Application to solidarity fund from researchers of less-affluent countries
12th – 20nd January 2016	Decisions on funding sent out
1st – 31st January 2016	Submission of posters (by those not applying for the solidarity fund)
22nd – 28st February 2016	Decisions on acceptance of posters sent out
